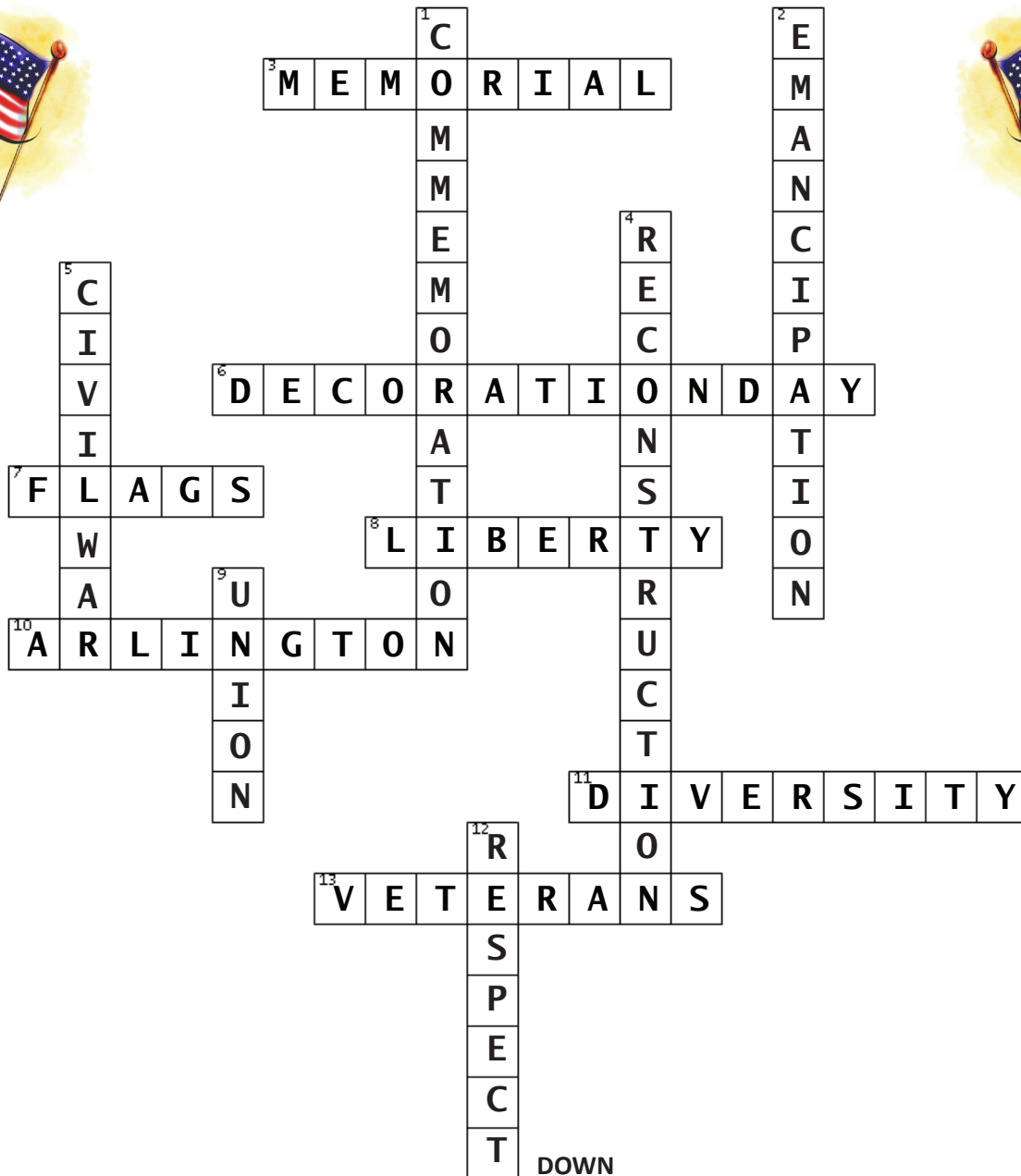


Honoring Memorial Day
